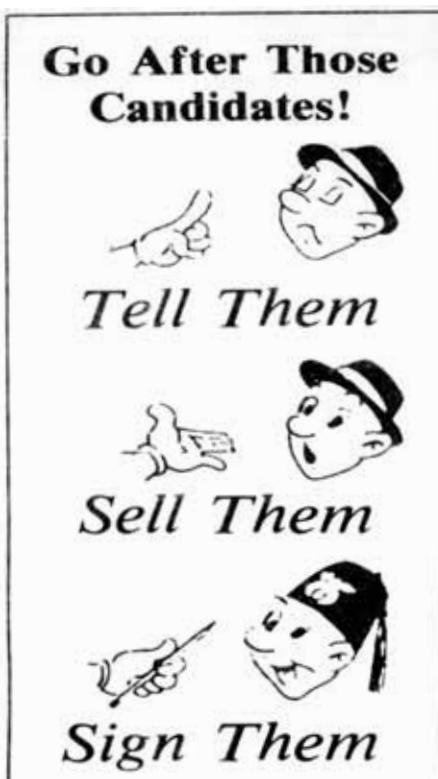

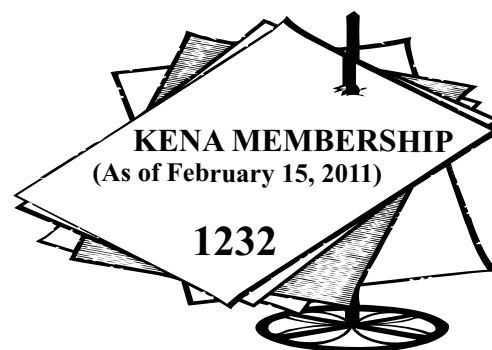

**Chaplain’s Message
with Peace & Joy
J. Blaine Blubaugh**

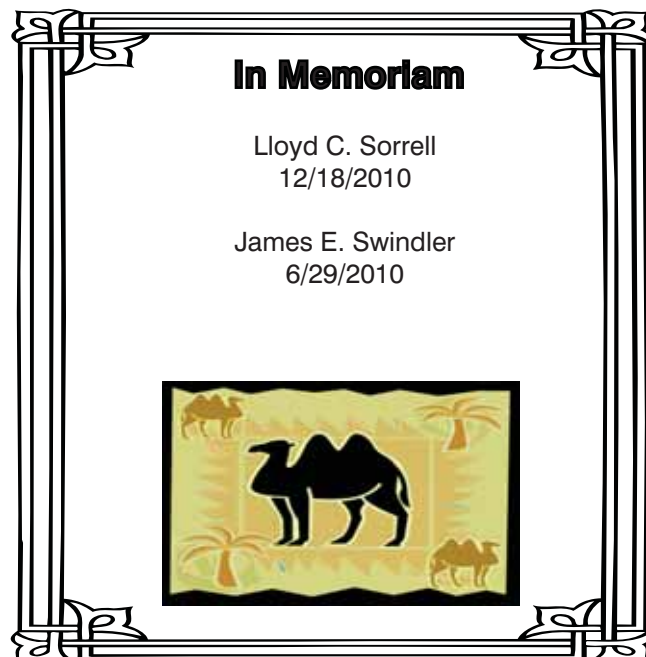
What does it take to motivate people? Millions of dollars worth of motivational books, CD's, and seminars have wrestled with this question. If you have the answer, it will make you rich. A more pleasing question for many of us is, "How can I motivate myself to do the things I know I ought to do?" Can you relate to this question? Self motivation is just as tricky as motivating others. That is why they have "self-help" sections in book stores.

In June of 2009, President Obama visited Buchenwald Prison in Germany, where more than 56,000 prisoners were slain by the Nazis in World War II. Buchenwald was a hell on earth. Among the prisoners at Buchenwald was a group of Jewish doctors. The doctors were treated like everyone else. According to Dr. Jim Standiford, "They got up at 4:00 a.m. like everyone else. They stood up for roll call after roll call in the shivering cold like everyone else. They went out and worked on the roads like everyone else. When it was dark they were brought in like everyone else and given cold, thin soup that barely nourished them. But when everyone else went to sleep, those doctors huddled together in the back of their barracks and they talked with each other. They stimulated each other's minds. They talked about situations among their fellow prisoners and how they might treat them – if only they had the medicine. They kept challenging each other. Finally they stopped talking and they began to act. They secured items from here and there. They bribed the guards so they could bring in some material. With the help of some other prisoners who were electricians and engineers, they fabricated a very rudimentary x-ray machine so they could examine their fellow prisoners and help them as much as possible." They knew like every other prisoner that their only reward would be death in a crematorium. Yet they continued to do the work of God ministering to their fellow inmates,

Most of us do not live under those extreme conditions. Most of us will never really suffer for our faith. Most of us will never even be socially ostracized. But many of us are in situations in which we are not appreciated, even though we are doing the best we can. Some of us are caring for aging parents, some for special needs children and others for a spouse. Some of us are working against great odds to make our community a better community. We do believe that we have been set apart to make a difference.

We need to realize that our efforts are not in vain and that what we do does make a difference. We have been set aside for service, so let us serve with

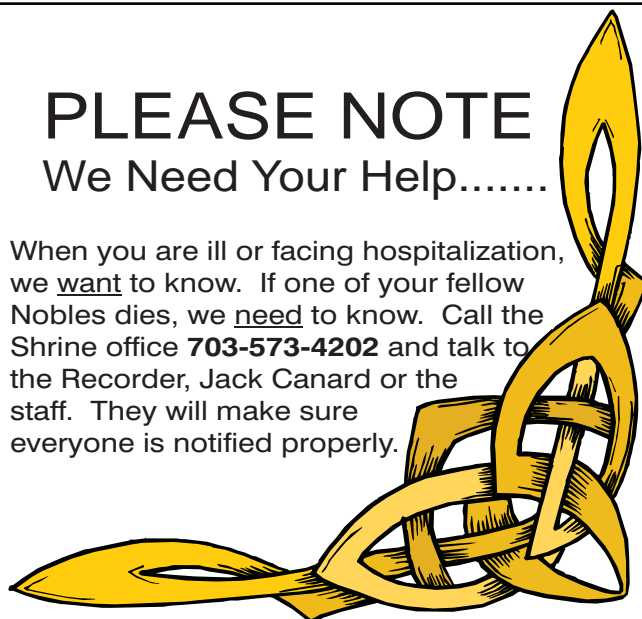

The Mid Atlantic Shrine Association (MASA) was constituted on November 23, 1940 and now consists of 24 Shrine Temples from New York, Connecticut, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, the District of Columbia, Virginia and West Virginia.

MASA IS A PREMIER ASSOCIATION The Association is proud to have as one of its own, Past Imperial Potentate Raoul Frevel, Jr. — a well-known and staunch supporter of Kena and a member of Boumi Shriners in nearby Baltimore where the 2005 Imperial Session was held.

Word around Imperial Headquarters is that Imperial Officers usually volunteer to attend the annual MASA conventions in Virginia Beach and the Spring Meeting, because of its reputation of being the most effective and best run Association in Shrinedom.

KENA'S TIES TO MASA ARE LONG AND STRONG We first participated in MASA in September 1954, and we have had three Past Potentates serve as its president; Illustrious Sirs Howard S. Clinkenbeard (1965-66), Henry A. Davis, (1990-91) and Daniel L. Levin, (2005-06). A fourth Past Potentate, Illustrious Arnold F. "Arnie" Brown, is currently the 2nd Vice President and expected to become the President of MASA for 2012-13.

Two Kena Past Potentates, Illustrious Sirs Edward E. Buckley and James S. Riley have served as Presidents of the MASA Cabiri (an association of Past Potentates founded in 1956). Numerous other Kena Nobles have served as presidents of MASA Unit Associations; Noble Marvin "Mac" McAfee (Kena 500) the 2010 President of the MASA Motor Corps and Noble Anthony "Boss Klown" LaCava is slated chair the MASA Clown Association this year.

In addition to Kena's past Association presidents, its unit associations and the Cabiri, we have twenty-six official representatives to MASA: six consisting of our Potentate down to the Recorder; two additional Nobles elected annually, and eighteen past potentates.

Traditionally, the MASA "counterparts", have a social weekend each year where members of the progressive Divans assemble to have fun with their contemporaries and to coordinate and plan their schedule of visits to other activities for the year that they will become potentates. It is at these sessions that temple themes, mottos and designs for their souvenir pins take place. Kena has had numerous presidents of these 'counterparts' classes."

MASA OFFERS MANY OPPORTUNITIES TO PARTICIPATE The Association offers a lot of opportunities to participate including annual competitions among units of its member temples, e.g. Chanters, Legions of Honor, Bands (including string bands [Mummers-type music] and Brass Concert Bands), Pipes (Highlanders), Drum & Bugle Corps, and Motorized units of all types and classes of vehicles including classic cars. In 2010, the Kena 500, Highlanders, Kena Klowns, Motor Corps, Camel Herders, Drum & Bugle Corps and the Colors were active participants and won several prestigious trophies.

To accommodate smaller temples, such as ours, MASA has established two divisions for completion to increase their opportunity recognition. That is, temples larger than 1800 members are in one division and those with 1800 or fewer members in another. Thus temples compete for trophies with temples of comparable size. Aside from unit competitions, MASA activities include a Shrine-A-Rama, a Pageant, and a Necrology Service remembering Past Potentates, a Cabiri Banquet, a traditional parade on Atlantic Avenue, and an open business meeting that includes by remarks the Imperial representatives and the Grand Masters. In the spring of each year a meeting is usually held in the oasis of the President's temple for the elected Divans and representatives. The requisite credentials for admission to these events are your registration badge.

MASA HAS GREAT CONVENTION FACILITIES The Convention Center at nearby Virginia Beach is a splendid, modern facility and just one of the reasons MASA has traditionally chosen Virginia Beach as the site for its annual conventions. For members of Kena, this is indeed a bonus—Sand, sun and fun in a major resort city just a few hours away! No other city has been as convenient or as accommodating in meeting MASA's needs.

The Virginia Beach officials really want us to enjoy ourselves and go all out to support MASA activities. The Mayor and Chief of Police welcome the Shriners, and local merchants display welcome signs, provide discounts, and free open areas for entertainment and competition. The Visitors Bureau in the city of Virginia Beach goes out of its way to provide several receptions, dinners and other events. And, they provide **FREE** bus service along the beach and back to the convention center.

They have installed new cable and new equipment for the computers to bring the system up to current standards. We are now getting a download speed in excess of 10 mbps and an upload speed in excess of 2 mbps for a connection to the Internet. We also now have available to all Units and Clubs located in the Temple the complete cable TV package offered by Cox Communications. With the volunteer work done by Nobles William and Sully, we now have a first class, very functional system at a very reasonable cost to the Temple. Please join me in thanking these Nobles for their dedicated support of Kena Shriners and bringing us into the 21st century of electronic services.
